To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 38932 for 80 acres, issued in favor of *Zacchens Pate, Private in Captain McPhatters Company third Regiment North Carolina Militia Mar 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South West quarter of the North West quarter and the North West quarter of the South West quarter of Section two in Township two of Range twenty four in the District of Lands subject to sale at Sparta Alabama Containing Eighty Acres, and fifteen hundredths of an Acre* according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been assigned unto James Gilley*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *James Gilley*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *James Gilley and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
