

# APPLICATION FOR PENSION

## UNDER LAWS OF FLORIDA

(FORM A)  
FOR USE OF APPLICANT FOR PENSION

I, J. W. Peacock, do hereby make application to the State Board of Pensions, for a pension to be granted to me under the act of 1907, Chapter 5600 of the Laws of the State of Florida, upon the following grounds:

I enlisted and served in the Military service of Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that I did not desert the Confederate or State service; that I was a bona-fide citizen of this State for ten years prior to the date of this application and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Florida, and that I
