Before me, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Ellen Tew, of Geneva County, Alabama, Slcoomb, who is personally known to me and who after being duly sworn deposes and says as follows:

My name is Ellen Tew. I am eighty-four (84) years old. I, Ellen Tew, state under oath I knew the Ward family, James B. Ward and Elisabeth English Ward and all their children. They had eight (8) children borned to them. Their names are as follows: John Jackson Ward; Thomas Jefferson Ward; James Madison Ward; Benjamin Franklin Ward; Elizabeth Ward; Mary Ward; and Monroe Ward. I knew the Davis family well. James M. Davis married Mary Ward, daughter of James B. and Elisabeth English Ward. James M. Davis and Mary Ward Davis raised a family of thirteen (13) children, their names are as follows: Julia Davis; Jonas Davis; James M. Davis; John G. Davis; Mellisa Davis; Reagy Davis; Allen Thomas Davis; Hicy Davis; Susan Davis; Betsy Davis; Carrie Davis; Joseph Davis; and Jasper Davis. They lived six (6) miles from my father. I knew both families well. I knew them from childhood up. Elisabeth English Ward was a full-blooded Creek Indian. The last years of her life she lived with her daughter, Mary Ward Davis.

I am not related by blood or marriage to Elisabeth English Ward or any of her descendants. I am not related by blood or marriage to any of the DAVIS family.
